<p><b>Program Description</b></p> <p>The Associate of Arts, AA (<a href="https://catalog.jccc.edu/archives/2025-26/degree/requirements/associate-arts/">https://catalog.jccc.edu/archives/2025-26/degree/requirements/associate-arts/</a>) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners well with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students pursuing the AA may select courses that satisfy both the AA degree requirements and lower division requirements for a bachelor's degree at four-year institutions. The elective hours within the AA allow students to complete additional general education and lower division courses required for specific majors. The AA degree requires completion of 60 credit hours. Meeting with a JCCC counselor (<a href="https://www.jccc.edu/student-resources/counseling/academic-counseling/">https://www.jccc.edu/student-resources/counseling/academic-counseling/</a>) is strongly recommended for selection of appropriate courses.</p> <p>Transfer credits for JCCC students are evaluated on a course-by-course basis at MU. All students must complete MU graduation requirements beyond the MU general education requirements.</p>
