#### Program Description

An agreement between Johnson County Community College and Wichita State University provides students who have completed the JCCC Registered Nurse Associate of Applied Science (<https://catalog.jccc.edu/archives/2025-26/degreecertificates/nursing/nursing-reg-nurse-aas/>) the opportunity to complete a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree at WSU. The RN<sup>1</sup> to BSN<sup>2</sup> degree completion program at WSU, offered completely online, is intended for students who have graduated from an accredited nursing program and hold a current license in nursing.

#### Program Requirements:

To be eligible for admission to the WSU RN to BSN program, applicants must have:

- 1) An earned associate degree from a regionally accredited school with an accredited nursing program.
- 2) A minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average.
- 3) A passing score on NCLEX-RN (very recent graduates may be able to begin the program before sitting for this examination).
- 4) Completion of all required prerequisite courses. These 9 courses can be completed at JCCC; see table on next page.

### ADDITIONAL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:

- 1) For all bachelor's degrees granted by WSU, at least 30 credit hours must be earned at WSU. In addition, at least 24 of the last 30 credit hours applied towards the degree must have been completed at WSU.
- 2) WSU requires a minimum of 45 upper division credit hours. However, 30 of these awarded via Credit for Life Experience + the 31 hours of new coursework, RN-BSN students will have no problem meeting this requirement.
- 3) WSU requires a minimum of 120 total hours to graduate. This includes any transferred hours from a regionally accredited school. For example, a student with an associate degree must transfer at least 89 credit hours to complete the program without taking any additional elective coursework to meet the 120-hour graduation requirement.

### Conditions of Transfer:

JCCC students who earn an associate degree in nursing with a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average, and who have a current nursing license, will be eligible to matriculate to the WSU academic program in place for that catalog year. The RN to BSN degree completion program at WSU is completely online and accessible 24 hours a day. It can be completed in as little as three (3) semesters or up to six (6) years.

### Credit Awarded for Life Experience:

WSU awards 30 upper division credit hours of Credit for Life Experience<sup>7</sup> for admitted students who demonstrate successful completion of the NCLEX-RN national exam.

- The 30 hours of Credit for Life Experience counts towards two of the graduation requirements: The University requires 45 upper division credit hours.
