# **Associate of Arts**

## The associate of arts degree from JCCC:

- is designed for students who plan to transfer to another college or university to earn a bachelor's degree.
- requires a minimum of 60 college-level credit hours within specified categories with a 2.0 or higher GPA.
- requires a minimum of 34 credit hours of Kansas Systemwide General Education requirements.
- requires a minimum of 25 additional credit hours of open electives.
- requires the completion of a JCCC Cultural Diversity designated course (p. 9) from a list of approved courses. Some of the courses in this list will also meet Kansas Systemwide General Education requirements.

The associate of arts degree is designed as a transfer degree. Students should refer to transfer information (https://www.jccc.edu/student-resources/ transfer/), meet with a JCCC counselor (https://www.jccc.edu/student-resources/counseling/academic-counseling/), and create a plan when selecting
