Transfer Admission Procedures/Qualifications

How to Apply:

- Complete an application (<https://www.washburn.edu/admissions/apply.html>) for admission.
- Submit official transcripts (<https://www.washburn.edu/admissions/transcripts.html>) from each post-secondary school where you've taken courses for credit.
- Submit official high school transcripts ** (only if you've taken less than 24 credit hours)

**While ACT scores are not required for admission for transfer students, it may be helpful to send them or take a placement exam when choosing courses.

Tuition/Fees/Expenses

Interstate Advantage: You can get an awesome out-of-state experience for an in-state price! Washburn University offers in-state undergraduate tuition for students from outside of the state of Kansas in the United States.

This reduces the cost of an education by up to \$11,790 per year! And making sure you receive the waiver is easy, you just have to apply (<https://www.washburn.edu/admissions/apply.html>) to Washburn University!

- Eligible undergraduate students from surrounding states (and Texas) are charged resident tuition.

- All undergraduate courses are billed at resident rates for the summer term.
- **Student fees** are charged to all students taking one or more classes, online or on campus, except during the summer term, and are **non-refundable once the term begins**
- Enrollment – WU students with 0.5 or more credit hours \$70 per term
